However, as of September 30, 2025, total amount spent stands at Rs.80.04 crore. The management has indicated that SSKL is planning to establish multiple outlets in strategic locations which will capture the market well. However, the same is a lengthy procedure and company is adding multiple stores every quarter. Hence, there is a delay in implementation of the same. The entire funds are to be utilized by end of March 2026.

Object 2 - Funding capital expenditure for setting of two new warehouses: As per yearly implementation schedule provided in the offer document, SSKL had to spend entire funds by end of March 2024. However, as of September 30, 2025, total amount spent stands at Rs. 2.82 crore. The management had indicated that they are planning to establish the warehouse in a strategic location, so to serve all the showrooms in Tamil Nadu with an object of minimizing the cost of logistics as well as maintenance costs. Hence, there is a delay in implementation of the same. The same is ratified in the Board meeting held on May 24, 2024.

Object 3 - Funding working capital requirements of our company: As per yearly implementation schedule provided in the offer document, SSKL had to spend Rs. 228.98 crore by end of March 31, 2025, out of the total earmarked funds. However, as of September 30, 2025, total amount spent stands at Rs.186.20 crore. The payments to vendors for supply of material to newly opened showrooms would be made through the available funds as and when the invoices are due. The utilization of these funds would depend on opening of new showrooms. Hence, there is a delay in implementation. The entire funds are to be utilized by end of March 2026.

Object 5 - General Corporate purposes: As per yearly implementation schedule provided in the offer document, SSKL had to spend entire funds by end of March 2024. However, as of September 30, 2025, total amount spent stands at Rs.82.90 crore.

*The company had repaid Rs.47.12 crore as of March 31, 2024. The payment of of Rs.2.88 crore was delayed which was to be utilised towards repayment of borrowings. However, the same was repaid during Q1FY25. The reason for delaying the repayments is to avoid the prepayment charges.
